Summer Research Fellowships Funded by the National Fragile X Foundation's Rosen/Weingarden Summer Fellowship Research Fund 2015 Request for Applications

The National Fragile X Foundation will fund one or more summer student research fellowships at \$2,500 each through the Rosen/Weingarden Summer Fellowship Research Fund. The student's work can be in the area of fragile X syndrome (FXS), fragile X-associated tremor/ataxia syndrome (FXTAS) or fragile X-associated primary ovarian insufficiency (FXPOI).

This award is meant to introduce undergraduate students or students in professional training programs to research in the Fragile X field by providing funding for a summer project. It is not meant to supplement funds for PhD candidates or post-doctoral fellows working on research related to Fragile X.

- 2. Aims and hypothesis
- 3. Methods (participants, procedure, materials)

- 5. Expected Outcomes and relevance to Fragile X

SECTION C

- 1. The applicant's one-page CV including any relevant experience
- 2. The supervisor's brief bio-sketch

3. Three recent publications from the supervisor that relate to Fragile X (List publication's title and provide web links *or* attach the actual publication)

The applicant can be either an undergraduate or graduate student, and the supervisor should be experienced in research concerning Fragile X.

The research proposal should state how the project will expand our knowledge of Fragile X and how the fellowship will provide a distinctive training experience.

All awardees will be required to write a brief description of their experience for possible publication by the National Fragile X Foundation.

The application, including the email, must be submitted by the student.
